

**Minutes of South Carolina Area Assembly
SC State Museum, 301 Gervais (Corner of Gervais and Huger Streets), Columbia, SC**

Saturday, – October 1, 2011, 10:00 AM – 4:00 PM Chairman – Jeri W
10:00 AM to 10:45 AM

Welcome – Opened with the Serenity Prayer - The Concepts and General Warranties were read by Danny B.

Welcome to Newcomers – Newcomers were asked to stand and everyone gave them a big Al-Anon welcome. There were 9 newcomers. There was a moment of silence for Betty Sue Wilkie who passed away in June. These people made our lives a little bit easier by coming before us and keeping Al-Anon alive.

Approval of Area Assembly Minutes – Minutes from June 2, 2011 were presented for vote by Melanie M. A change was made to include reports from Districts 3, 4 8 & 9. The change was sent to Mike M. to post on the website. Motion to accept the minutes was made by Marie J. and seconded by Julie B. and unanimously approved.

Treasurer's Report –Fran B. - Beginning Balance is \$7,651.51. Income for the period was \$6,381.13 and total expenses were \$4,909.86 and ending balance of \$ 9,122.78. Motion to accept Treasurer's Report as submitted was made by Debra and seconded by Mary L. and unanimously approved.

Fran explained that she was now the Treasurer and not Mary Ellen R. Anything that goes to Mary Ellen from this point on will be sent back and to please make sure that it gets to her so that their group will get credited for their contributions.

Chairman - Jeri W. – Jeri went through the ABC's of what she felt Al-Anon Service work entailed. She explained that she wanted it to be exhilarating and fun. The following are the ABC's of Al-Anon Service:

- Q**uiet my mind in the midst of controversy
- R**esponsibility – what's mine and what's yours
- S**ervice sponsor
- T**eachability – try to learn something new
- U**se the service manual
- V**ote my conscience when information is presented
- W**illingness to ask for help
- X**hilarate others to become involved
- Y**ou aren't in charge, Jeri – God is
- Z**ebra – not everything is black and white; mine isn't the only way

Report: Jeri was proud to announce that every district was represented at this AWSC. Woooo Hoooo!!! I sit at my desk thinking about what to share at Assembly...hmmm. As with my own spiritual awakenings, it doesn't come in a flash of light, but it comes in a subtle, gentle way. I stop and think and ask for my Higher Power's help. Then a direction is given to me. My only job is to listen with an open heart and mind.

As I grow through my journey in meetings and service work, I am reminded of my history and where I am today. Maybe this thought comes to me because I've been reading Many Voices, One Journey. Today it's important to see the progress we are experiencing and expressing with our families, in the rooms of Al-Anon and Alateen, and in our communities. In South Carolina I would like each of you to reflect on how you can be open to all that lies ahead of us and how our journeys can be positive and overflowing towards one another. How can we strive towards those ideals? How about beginning with TEAM? Our dual-chaired topics are Conflict Resolution, Concepts of Service, and Transitioning Alateens into Al-Anon. Isn't this a great way to start by:

- learning and practicing how to communicate in harmony with one another even when we initially may not see eye to eye; continuing to be part of the solution instead of the problem,
- Referring to our Service Manual section on the concepts of service when we are lost and don't know what the next right thing to do is, and
- Making sure the Alateens are valued and that they are welcomed into our South Carolina events so that they feel "a part of" instead of "apart from".

So much work to do, but in this case, work isn't a four letter word and we never do it alone. It's about hope for our future in South Carolina. I have faith that more people will get involved in service work and that each of you will reflect on how getting in the middle of Al-Anon/Alateen has become a vital part of your recovery.

What are we as a panel doing today?

- trying to reinforce how important it is to pick up the phone when emails and texting just don't give us the whole picture
- continually updating the website to make it full of useful information for anyone who needs Al-Anon and Alateen
- getting accurate group records so each group gets WSO information in a timely manner
- asking for someone to take on the position of Spanish Liaison Coordinator or Institutions Coordinator on the area level; these positions are still open
- discussing how Alateen can grow in our state via e-communities and our website

What is in the immediate future?

- Thought forces; establishing a group of people as a "think tank" in regards to our current action committees' structure
- Task forces; taking the thought force results and finishing the project; we will be doing this with the convention guidelines

Both of these groups will be reporting to AWSC on August 27th.

For background information:

Once a thought force completes its job, it is followed by discussion at AWSC to see if further action is needed. AWSC may conclude that we need to develop a task force to accomplish the final results. Whatever the decision may be, there will be discussion.

How are these groups going to be successful? By using informed group conscience – the key word being "informed". You can get more information about this process by going to our new book and looking up "knowledge-based decision making" in the index.

How can you help? That's easy - by volunteering to engage in this process. As always, I stress the importance of rotation of service. We are inclusive, not exclusive.

Alternate Delegate - Joyce H. – I am now looking forward to visiting groups within Area 50. I feel that this will benefit me and also the groups to have the chance to have a one-on-one connection. I would also like to visit some District meetings to see how a difference or similarity that there is within Districts in the Area.

We are coming up on 1 year since voting for your new panel, it has been a year of learning, reminding myself Principals above Personalities and no matter how hard I try, I still am not perfect. I “Keep Coming Back,” not to finally achieve perfection, but to do what is necessary in this program to know the difference

Delegate’s Report – Jan R. - Jan put out a basket at the back of the room for questions, “To ask the Delegate.” She answered those questions that came up. She explained that being delegate was really more that she thought it was going to be and going to the World Service Conference was awe inspiring. To see the group conscience work and a Higher Power presence in the room while they were voting on the property matter was amazing. There was no atmosphere of tension and everyone is equal and not separate in the meetings. She is amazed at the amount of email that she gets. She gets a lot from WSO, but she gets more than she thought she would get from all over the state. If you try and get something done through WSO they will contact Jan about it first and then she will in turn contact you.

Report: First, I would like to thank everyone for their prayers, cards and well wishes during my hip replacement. I am on the mend and almost back to 100 %. I hope I am walking like a normal person by Assembly.

I have some news from WSO:

- There are some Trustee-At-Large positions open. If you are interested in applying, please let me know.
- The International Al-Anon General Services Meeting will be held in Cape Town, South Africa this year. This will allow us to bring the fellowship of Al-Anon to those who need us.
- A new piece of literature on intimacy is in the works. WSO is looking for sharings for “Intimacy in Alcoholic Relationships” (working title). I have more information if you are interested in sending in a sharing.
- Al-Anon is now on Twitter and Facebook. You can “like” them (Al-Anon WSO) on Facebook and receive postings from WSO. Members are asked not to post comments.
- Al-Anon Family Groups Headquarters (Canada) Inc. has a new virtual office in Ottawa effective September 1.
- Some groups will be receiving information regarding a newcomer’s survey. If you have any questions, please contact me.
- There have been 3 TEAM events so far and 4 more are scheduled through next April.

I would like to ask how many of you have been handing out “How Al-Anon Works” to your newcomers. With the idea of Abundant Resources, Al-Anon is trying to carry the message in having these paperback versions at a lower cost. I hope all your groups are taking advantage of this opportunity for outreach. Another possibility is using them for outreach to professionals, carrying the message to areas that reach a diverse population (i.e., hair salons, churches, etc.)

While I was at conference we were visited by the Spirit of Generosity – a member dressed up similar to a Leprechaun, and tossing out coins and bills (with his picture on them!) We were presented with vignettes of situations that depicted where the money sent to WSO is used for outreach, literature, etc. Each vignette was accompanied by “Our Spirit Soars with Every Gift” to the tune of “When the Saints Go Marching In.” This emphasized how our contributions are being used in very real ways daily. One way we can increase our contributions in our group is to suggest that members think about contributing more than their usual contribution one week out of each month. In the almost quarter century that I’ve been in Al-Anon, members are still donating \$1 to the basket – while prices have risen on literature, rent, coffee, insurance, gas, etc. exponentially during that time. Right now groups that do contribute average \$104.04 per groups, while WSO’s cost for serving each group is \$238.23 per group.

Other information to keep you updated is:

- ∇ Online Group Records
- ∇ This allows all Area Delegates and Group Records Coordinators to look at and report on group information for their Area, as well as allowing Area Group Records Coordinators to update group information directly in the WSO database.
- ∇ Future plans include registering Alateen meetings on-line after insuring the safety requirements for each Area will be met.
- ∇ Unlimited Abundant Resources Skills Inventory Database
- ∇ Right now, there are over 1,000 members, but we are always interested in members who would like to offer their expertise to be of service.
- ∇ In the future, there will be a page to update a member's status and to opt out after submitting the data, if the member so chooses.
- ∇ Alateen Chat
- ∇ Eight areas host chat rooms: four in the United States and four in Canada.
- ∇ The registration process is now automatic for teens; they no longer have to wait to be added to the system.
- ∇ The registration process has been translated into French, Spanish, and German.
- ∇ Blogs
- ∇ There are now twelve active blogs: six English, three French, and three Spanish.
- ∇ 'For Members and Groups' and 'Thinking Abundantly in...' are the two newest blogs.
- ∇ Audio is being added to the Traditions blog each month.
- ∇ e-Communities
- ∇ Quite a few communities were added last year, including one for past and current Conference members.
- ∇ The discussion forums are being used by some communities.
- ∇ Area Chairpersons and District Representatives will be the next two communities to be added.
- ∇ Electronic Newsletters and Notifications
- ∇ In early July all members who were listed as the Current Mailing Address for a specific meeting, and had an e-mail address in the WSO data base, were sent the CMA Newsletter.
- ∇ A second mailing to key service people went out at the end of July with the announcement of the Appeal Letter.
- ∇ The plan is to use this process for an e-News for Professionals newsletter and to notify members who formally received Area Highlights that it is posted on the Members' Web site. Many additional notices that would have been posted in multiple communities will now come via this system to avoid Delegates and other trusted servants receiving an e-mail notification for every e-community they can access.
- ∇ Electronic Literature
- ∇ This is still being researched and discussed. As soon as there is anything concrete, the Conference members will receive notification.

The Theme for the 2012 World Service Conference has been announced. It is "Our Spiritual Journey – We Get as We Give." We do this in practicing the program, participating in service, being willing to sponsor, etc. I am looking forward to the conference and all the information I will be able to bring back to you from it.

I have conference summaries for all of you today so that you can see what we did at conference. If you would like additional summaries, they can be ordered from WSO for the cost of shipping them.

In closing I would like to share with you my wish list for the area. I think it would be great if we could find a way to have assemblies that included fellowship and fun and not just the "business" for the area. Other

areas have multi-day assemblies (2-3) days that include workshops, discussion groups, GR breakfasts with the coordinators, speakers, etc. We could reduce the number of Assemblies we have each year and have them as 2 day assemblies and include some 'fellowship' time in these. Just something to think about. My other wish would be that we re-look at how we do other things, such as conventions, and allow for some "out-of-the-box" thinking. I recently attended a convention in another area that was only Friday-Sunday. They had a speaker on Friday night, 3 speakers on Saturday and one on Sunday. The speakers chaired the 3 workshops they had on Saturday. It was a filled weekend, but it still allowed for time to just fellowship with the members. Again, something to think about.

The last thing is communication. When we presume good will and make an effort to communicate clearly with each other, information gets shared and things occur smoothly. Let's all make an effort to communicate well with each other.

Recently a survey was sent out by WSO that was being conducted by a university student. John C. of District 6 told Jan R. that someone who received the email was very upset that the information was going to a university and was being used for other purposes than for WSO's benefit. Jan was to give him a letter from Rick B., (WSO Executive Director) about that. Jan said that going on Al-Anon's E-Community would be a good place to start a discussion about that topic

Alateen - Jan H. At the last AWSC I described a growing concern about our declining numbers and referenced the frustration of providing timely Alateen referrals to newcomers through our current word of mouth. I was asked by the panel to prepare a formal motion for consideration at this AWSC meeting to include rationale and support documentation. The following represents that request along with a statement, collected facts and documentation.

STATEMENT: This is a call for help to (SC) Al-Anon to resuscitate our (SC) Alateen program. It appears that our once vital Alateen fellowship, one of the oldest in the nation, is being snuffed out for lack of access and nourishment. We are in need of support in all areas – emotional, spiritual, physical and financial. The following has been prepared based on information gathered and...detective work that has been required in my transition of office serving as AAC since January 1, 2011. I believe I speak as the majority voice today of our participating fellowship from those in attendance at our business meetings, participating as sponsors of Alateen groups teen and adult members participating in Alateen groups and events. Among this fellowship are teens actively involved over 7 years, and adult members who have served at all levels of SC Al-Anon service and active in Alateen service over 18 year's.

MOTION: I would like to move that the following changes regarding the dispersing of Alateen information be made immediately: that Alateen meeting information be provided the same access as Al-Anon meetings. This includes publishing the day, times and meeting locations in all the same manner as Al-Anon meetings enjoy. *** See NOTE

Further, I would like to request the following of our fellowship:

1. **Of AFGs:** Please announce the availability of Alateen in the opening or closing of your meetings indicating time, day, location of the nearest Alateen meeting in your district, having in hand the primary contact information of the group. When no Alateen meeting is nearby, please have a list of where Alateens meet in the area with contacts and strive to include Alateen literature to welcome Alateens to your meetings.
2. **Of DRs:** Please ask your district fellowship to make Alateen a priority. This priority includes the above (#1) Consider becoming a certified AMIAS and ask others to do the same, Appoint a District Alateen coordinators (adult and teen), to link groups and Area representatives; Provide opportunities in your meetings and all day events for Alateens and Alateen Sponsors to share and aim for offering at least one weekly Alateen meeting in your district.
3. **Of the Area Public Outreach:** Publish a list of SC Alateen Meetings (day/time/address of meeting location) and a contact on the members' only pages of the area website. (To be provided)

4. **Of the Area Public Outreach:** Publish certified Alateen Sponsor contact information (like DRs are listed) in the same area of the website...[to be provided]
5. **Of the Area Public Outreach:** Add Alateen meetings (day, time and location) in all the same public avenues that Al-Anon meetings currently appear... on the website, on district & regional meeting lists distributed, reference on telephone hotlines (assuring all those answering the phone are informed) and include a map quest link for driving directions to the website meeting list.

Other Related Forthcoming Concerns:

1. Call for opportunities and support for Alateen fundraising opportunities within the Al-Anon fellowship on local, district and area events.
2. Call for a review of SC requirements to certification Alateen Sponsors.

RATIONALE: As new coordinator 6 months into the Area Alateen post, I was challenged turning up pertinent Alateen meeting information and Alateen Sponsor contact information for the actively meeting Alateen groups and still further lack of clarity on those no longer meeting. What I have turned up is that our SC Alateen fellowship is in rapid decline. Meetings are disappearing, sponsors are not re-certifying in all districts except District 6. Much has surfaced through my efforts to respond to the public Alateen e-mail box established in March this year. Disseminating Alateen information to newcomers is labor intensive, untimely with difficult to no follow up. More importantly, it appears to be unnecessary and goes against our primary purpose - to help other Alateens.

At all Alateen business meetings this year, teens and sponsors shared in several concerns. How to find better ways to share with each other and how to increase participation in our events? These discussions always return to concerns unique to Alateen public outreach. There is a serious breakdown of providing timely referral information to newcomers. The secrecy of meeting information and breakdown in updating contact information is keeping the general public from Alateen help – and is a roadblock to our sustenance not to mention growth. While there are some obvious internal systems we can improve, it is time for a real change of access to Alateen in SC.

Further, this current secrecy of Alateen meeting information implies there is some heightened risk for teens attending Alateen meetings compared to other community youth service organizations openly publicized online and in print for community access. Little League baseball schedules, girl scout and boy scout weekly meetings and their overnight camps, public library after-school tutoring, pre-school reading programs, youth tennis matches, dance classes, youth choir rehearsals, bible school classes, weekly day camps and much, much more are available in the news, online and community calendars.

FACTS:

1. Alcoholism is a family dis-ease. Al-Anon is adapted from AA providing recovery to affected members of the family. Alateen is a part of Al-Anon, the recovery program for our youth ages 13 – 19. When an Alateen meeting is not available, teens are welcomed to Al-Anon meetings.
2. Alateen is a feeder program to Al-Anon. Some areas encourage teens to transition to Al-Anon even before they reach 19.
3. SC Alateen Program is 35 years old, one of the oldest in the nation.
4. WSO instituted core Alateen behavior guidelines in 2003 allowing area autonomy...in particular to address state laws related to working with youth; SC Area Behavior Requirements were instituted in 2004.
5. There is nothing written in SC Alateen Behavior Requirements addressing how we can or cannot post Alateen meeting information to the public. However, there has been a restriction passed down verbally, member to member and to sponsors through SC certification training restricting the posting of Alateen meeting information to the public. Personal screening has been required through internal Al-Anon/Alateen members.
6. Internal Al-Anon channels are untimely, labor intensive and have broken down.

7. Times have changed. SC Alateen public outreach has not. SC has not stayed current with other area Alateen standard practices. All areas but one or possibly 2 post Alateen meeting information alongside Al-Anon and AA meetings on their printed schedules and online. The new standard is electronic/digital/satellite and global. Our new vocabulary includes Google, Broad Band, Wikipedia, Cloud Computing, Wi-Fi, Twitter, YouTube, Face book, Pandora & Flickr to mention only a few. Access is the new pressing agenda and the standard in all communications whether business, news, social including the 12-step program. Has anyone Googled an AA/Al-Anon or Alateen meeting lately? Out state Alateen rep has and has attended 4 out of state Alateen meetings on his summer travels. I received voicemails and text messages about his experiences and hopes that we can have the same in SC. WSO has recently established a Facebook page. Alateen Chat meetings are being encouraged and any meeting is open to any teen that registers.
8. WSO does not advise areas to NOT post weekly Alateen meeting information. They encourage the opposite. The only thing WSO has cautioned areas about is considering not posting annual Alateen Conference information because these gatherings are not typically designed for newcomers. However, this is only a suggestion.
9. Out of 67 areas, SC remains one of possibly 2 other areas that do not publish meeting information online and they, like us, are trying to change this practice. Alateen meetings are published right alongside their counterparts with Al-Anon and AA meetings noted.
10. In the not too distant past, a reported height of participating teens attending the annual SC Alateen (summer) Conference = **(100)**
11. Participating teens in 2011 = **(30)** (No records on participating sponsors.)
12. A former height of SC Alateen Groups meeting weekly = **(35)** and at least **(1)** group in every district.
13. One former group sponsor reported having **(28)** members; the group has long disbanded. Current groups (2 - 15) members.
14. At least **(6)** groups are either not meeting or have dissolved in the last five years. Only two new groups have formed.
15. **(2)** of **(9)** current Alateen groups are down to 2 or 3 regular members.
16. **(4)** Of **(10)** districts (1, 2, 8 & 10) have zero weekly Alateen meetings. AFGs meeting in these districts (6, 12 and 19).
17. **(3 of 7)** (4, 5, & 9) districts with active groups operating with **one** sponsor i.e. **(0)** back up certified AMIAS. WSO recommends that we have two. AFGs meeting in the same districts **22, 6, 16** several - meeting more than one day a week.
18. In the last year, Certified AMIAS dropped 50% with annual recertification complete - from **(50)** in 2010 to **(25)** in 2011.
19. Of (126 AFGs) and estimated 300+ Al-Anon members in SC - 8% are certified Alateen Sponsors, a requirement to assist Alateens directly or back up a current sponsor. This means 92% of the SC Al-Anon fellowship are ineligible to help Alateens directly, back up an Alateen sponsor when business, illness or personal travel conflicts or provide an Alateen a ride to a meeting, district, area or other program related event.
20. Alateen public inquiries via sc_alateen@yahoo.com reveals a demand throughout the state; the highest number to date are from the districts w/o weekly Alateen meetings.
21. Live, one-on-one contact with the fellowship when responding to public inquiries whether phone or e-mail is slow. Personally serving as sole responder to online inquiries, I find it requires regular review and transference of extensive contact information. Additionally, final connections can often be days even weeks later w/o assurance of follow up. With such an easy alternative (posting meeting information online) this outdated system appears to serve more as a roadblock to help.
22. Consultation with a SC Lawyer (specializing in criminal law) revealed zero added liability to taking Alateen meeting information public.
23. The rationale for SC's withholding meeting (day, time & location) from the public has been described as a safety measure to screen callers and provide protective measures in general, but more specifically protection from sexual predators. There is no evidence that our practices prevent sexual predators from doing anything. However, several other measures written into the SC Behavior Requirement code provides true safety measures. These include defining who can and

cannot attend Alateen meetings, that Alateens are with sponsors at all times until released to their parent or guardians, teens are not allowed to wander facilities alone or leave the buildings except with whom they came. Additionally, all Alateen meetings are held in the same buildings with their counterpart 12-step groups...AA/NA & Al-Anon meetings concurrently – except one group meeting in a high school where security from outsiders is also established.

24. I have personally visited over 20 different area websites including all states in the southeast and major metropolitan centers across the US. (Samples provided) Some code their meetings and include an index at the top or bottom, others id by the group name w/ Alateen in the title while many provide a MapQuest link for downloading driving directions.

Personal Experience:

The Alateen e-mail box sc_alateen@yahoo.com has required considerable time and review to turn up resources, (I.E... determining current status of active Alateen meetings, sponsor certification status and updated contact information.) If the AAC is challenged providing updated information on Alateen in SC, how could it improve through the channels? Since early March I have documented a steady stream of Alateen interest from all 10 districts – receiving inquiries even from districts w/ telephone hotlines. Facing the cold harsh reality of how FEW weekly Alateen meetings there are (9); the large expanse of the state absent Alateen, One meeting in the north...top 1/2 of the SE coastline; District Alateen Coordinators (4); Total (AMIAS) Al-Anon Members in Alateen Service (25). Then discovering how MANY Alateen Group Sponsors are getting by solo (1/3.) One might think this service is painful...yet checking in with current sponsors, they celebrate this decision to serve with our young adults as many admit this decisions among the best they have ever made. Ask them. We need more help and wonder why more aren't willing to join us?

This is not a criticism of members, our SC fellowship nor prior decisions but rather a look at the present to see what we might be able to do better. While we are excited about additions of the website, building our electronic communications, we are finding it difficult to grow w/out a stronger foundation.

MOTION: Jan made the following motion: I would like to move that the following changes regarding the dispersing of Alateen information be made immediately; that Alateen meeting information be provided the same access as Al-Anon meetings. This includes publishing the day, times and meeting location in all the same manner as Al-Anon meetings enjoy.

Rationale: To resuscitate the Alateen program in South Carolina. The Alateens are unable to find us and we need to be able to publish our meetings.

This will now go to the Area Assembly for vote.

Addendum to Area Alateen Report:

2011 SC Alateen Conference:

The 2011 SC Alateen Conference was a booming success. The groups involved with workshops, speakers presenting and /or participating included Together We Can Make It – Summerville, S.P.A.M. in Greenville, Open Door Alateen in Columbia, Gratitude Alateen in Charleston, Easy Does It Alateen in Beaufort, The Ultimate Alateen in Bluffton, C.A.N.A.D.A. in Aiken and Just for Today in Camden. A small but strong gathering of Alateen sponsors provided the essential foundation necessary to pull off this weekend of Alateen emersion and included: Bob C & Brandon W from Bluffton, Dennis W & Leslie S from Charleston, Sally M & Jan H from Beaufort, Susan O from Camden, Judy R from Greenville, Jane K from Aiken, Barb H

from Columbia, Mary V & Becky B from Summerville. THANK YOU is not strong enough said. There were 30 Alateens from around the state...some attending for their first time. An added 12 – mix of teens and adults – participated on Saturday only. The conference was self-supporting, and did not require tapping into the SCAC reserve savings. A complete financial accounting will be posted to the website.

SC Alateen Meetings with Alateen Sponsor contacts:

Alateen Coordinators and teen representatives. This listing will also be posted on the member's side of the website.

If the motion passes to allow public access to Alateen meetings as Al-Anon enjoys, this information can be used to immediately share with the public.

I am hoping to start a project educating all GR with their WSO ID #. This # is beneficial for group Treasurers also. If your Treasurer places this # on your contributions it will be much easier and efficient for Fran B. our Area Treasurer to post, same goes for you District Contributions and WSO. Please remember however that the appeal contributions are individual members and therefore group ID # is not to be used. Here is to Growing in Fellowship together.

I can now see online who is getting mail or not. If you are a GR and you step down, please get someone to get a mailing address until the group can get a new GR so that your group will continue to get all the information that they need to keep the group informed.

Website - Mike M. - We now have a protected web area on the SC website for the Alateen to get together and share. If the web doesn't have correct information please get with Joyce for changes. There are groups that are not in the area specified. Mike looks at the website as if he is a new person. Can I get to this meeting and walk in the door? We do have some descriptions. Make it as clear as possible. To his knowledge everything is up to speed. Please let him know of changes. Listings by districts are actually useless for anyone but old-timers. He is going to create a listing by city and county. He has a new map for the counties. Give him time he will get it up and running. It will connect to city, county and district when you go to our website. Look at the Calendar of Event's and make sure it is up-to-day. Get him the information electronically and it will look better. Links of Service - it is imperative that the DRs are functioning and alive and working with Mike. He loves new ideas and please get the groups and the districts to get them to him. They have to be approved, but funnel those ideas through the DR if possible, but he will take the ideas from anyone and will present that information for approval

Archive - Linda R. - Group histories are just a beginning. I would like to take this opportunity to encourage Groups and Districts to create an archival history of their respective entity. Group histories are being assembled, but how many groups have additional material about their history? How many districts have a district history or archives. Looking at the archives—including the histories—is one way in which we can see from whence we came and develop a sense of where we are going.

TEAM - Linda R. - Linda gave her final report on the TEAM event. There were some complaints, but there was nothing they could do about the length of the day and the lunches, We are forced to use the catering service in the museum, and the lunches weren't very good. The event didn't start out to be a fundraiser, but we made \$600 off of it.

Literature - Nan M. - Hi everyone recently I finished the book Many Voices, One Journey. (B-31) I found it to be loaded with our history in Al-Anon, but what is clearly unique about it is you will find many questions and sharing's that afford us the ability to climb into our own recovery work if we so choose. I encourage you all to use it in your groups for a meeting topic or maybe encourage your sponsees to read it daily in small sections to grow and learn in their program. Several groups in my district are taking How Al-Anon Works (B-32) in the paperback \$5.00 edition and ordering several and in turn giving it out to newcomers. Please take this back to your groups and ask them to consider this option. We have found the positive responses from newcomers to be a real sense of appreciation for our willingness to share this with them without any expectations. For me this is a nice way to practice Step 12. Our newest piece of literature is our 2011 World Service Conference Summary (P-46). By the time I share this with the fellowship I will probably have

completed my reading. What a wonderful way for service sponsors to support their sponsees in service. Consider investing the small amount of money to buy one for all your sponsees. Consider also, even if your service activity is limited, to share with others to gain a better understanding of how service in Al-Anon works in order to assure the preservation of our program. 3. The CAL Sample Chapter for October and December, can be found on the members' web site and the public outreach website, is within IN ALL OUR AFFAIRS (B-15). The topic is "From Denial to Awareness."

Public Outreach – Dian R. – The World Service Office has been researching the effectiveness of our most recent PSA (Public Service Announcement) campaign, **Sketches**. With this campaign, **Sketches**, has reached more than 27 English-speaking and 22 Spanish-speaking US markets. For Myrtle Beach, SC this meant that our PSA was played a total of **321 times** potentially reaching **7,748,360 viewers!** This is very encouraging and we would like to know if any of the local members would like to help say "Thank You" to the stations in their local viewing area that have played our PSA's and ask the station to continue playing them. We do not want or expect anyone to do it all, this is really about getting other members involved in Twelfth Step work.
