Saturday, – September 28, 2013 10:00 A.M. Chairman – Jeri W

Welcome – Opened with the Serenity Prayer - The Concepts and General Warranties were read by Sharla K.

Welcome to Newcomers – Jeri W. – There were 7 newcomers that were welcomed with a round of applause. There was a moment of silence for the members of the Assembly who had lost family members since the last Assembly.

Approval of Area Assembly Minutes – Minutes from June 8, 2013, were presented for vote by Melanie M. A motion to accept the minutes was made by David T. and seconded by Jeri W. and unanimously approved.

Treasurer's Report –Fran B. - Beginning Balance is \$12,282.00. Income for the period was \$8,267.27 and total expenses were \$6,131.76 with an ending balance of \$14,417.51. Motion to accept Treasurer's Report as submitted was made by Nan M. and seconded by Mary Ellen R. and unanimously approved.

Alternate Delegate/Group Records - Joyce H. – Well, here we are 3 years later, packing up and moving on. It has truly been an honor and a pleasure to serve on Panel 51. So many good Al-Anon's in this Area. I have grown more in service in these last 3 years than I ever

I hope that I was able to help in every way possible when I was called upon by the GR or DR give the information back in a timely manner and solve the problems that the groups were experiencing. Delegate's Report – Jan R. –This is my final AWSC report as your delegate. I am so very, very grateful that you honored me with the opportunity to serve South Carolina as your delegate. On this journey I have been able to truly understand the Al-Anon principles shown in our Twelve Concepts of Service. I have had the privilege of representing our Area at three conferences and an International Convention. Along the way, I have met many wonderful Al-Anon's and made some lifelong friends.

Some of the highlights of my term have been seeing the vote to determine permanent ownership of the Al-Anon building in Virginia Beach and the mortgage burning; walking in Lois Wilson's steps at Stepping Stones in Connecticut; voting on various issues – most recently on policy wording changes for the new Service Manual; connecting with Al-Anon members around the US and Canada and around the world; attending the International Convention in Vancouver; being on an Alaskan Cruise with 500 plus Al-Anon members and sitting in meetings and making new friends.

There are no words to describe how much this service has contributed to the growth of my program. I participated in the Day of Connecting at International and was able to attend a day long workshop on the Concepts. Some of the principles discussed were: Presume good will, mutual trust, mutual respect, participation, accountability, acceptance, responsibility, tolerance, flexibility, judgment, discipline, humility, and balance.

One of the quotes I took away from that workshop was: "Service is a recovery tool – a way to get a stalled program going. Get involved, take a job. It's the process that is important, not the end result. Take ownership and participate. There are always critics. Listen to them, take what's important – if valid, make adjustments – if not, thank them. Don't let them stop you from going forward."

Another: "The help of Al-Anon is in the meeting – not books, WSO, etc. It is just members talking to one another and sharing. Make sure the message of Al-Anon is in the group for the newcomer – every week."

I hope as we move to September and Area elections, you are able to fill all the group and district positions that are coming available. There is no reason not to ask people to fill these positions – we don't have to wait for the "spirit to move someone." A good leader is one who others want to follow. I know that we have good leaders at all levels in this Area. I also hope that you will all consider serving in another capacity at the Area level or have someone you think would be good in holding your position. We have had a wonderful three years with Panel 51 and I know that Panel 54 is going to be just as good or even better. Thank you, thank you, thank you for the love, support, encouraging words, good orderly direction and your friendship. It has been a great journey as your delegate!

Alateen - Jan H. - 2013 SC Alateen Conference - July 12-14, 2013 Report to Area / Sep 2013

A huge THANK YOU to many for our Alateen Conference this past July. Our Alateen fund raisers, AFG contributions and 63 participants made it possible for us to celebrate (complete with an opening parade) our 37th annual. From the last few years, we were up in teens (50) the same in sponsors (13) but down on attendance (2) for Open Saturday. A financial report and copy of the agenda is included at the bottom of this report.

The Camp agenda was created and directed by our Alateens with the support of their sponsors. It has been exciting to see our youth grow in taking responsibility for the many duties required of a weekend conference. From serving on the planning committees, creating an agenda, fund raising, stepping up to be a speaker, sharing a recovery workshop or activity with fellow Alateens to choosing the music for the DJ on deadline for their dance, the 2013 Conference was their combined success. Elections have been held, two officers elected, a new coordinator position added and a theme determined for 2014 SCAC.

For a second year in a row, we collaborated with Georgia Alateen. Our State Representative, Danny B, served as guest speaker at Georgia's Alateen Conference in June, and one of their teens served as ours in July. Additionally, a group of Georgia teens presented a guest workshop for the first time.

Our open Saturday, on the other hand was the lowest attendance in the last 7 years. Not sure why, as our programming continues to be excellent and fun for all ages. Ask Jan S & Mary M, our two celebrated Al-Anon's who were there. Open attendance is one of the ways we help cover the costs of our camp. Weekend registration pays only for meals and beds. All other programming expenses (from first aid to various camping activity supplies) need to be made up in fund raising and from your group contributions. We hope that you will be enticed to check it out live in person for yourself next year...although we are also very grateful for your checks! Thank You.

Please note that in the 2014 Budget you will be voting on today, that we are asking for an increase in our SC Alateen Conference advance. This is based on a change of policy with Camp Kinard where we have been going for 30 something years. This change thus far, does not include any increase in facility costs, only a change in when the payments are due. The amount to reserve our dates a year in advance has varied through the years, depending on the Board of Trustees. A contract in 2009 revealed that we formerly were asked to secure our contract with \$1000 down, while the past few years we have been asked to pay \$100 in advance. The new policy for 2014 requires a 30% deposit --- which comparable to last year's attendance cost would be closer to \$2000. Thus, we are asking \$2000 for that line item. This amount is paid back to the Area after the camp.

Moving forward, as I prepare for the transition out of this Area Service with 2014 elections, I want to express my gratitude for this opportunity and for the support I have received learning my job. It is not an easy one, but would not be as rewarding if I was not faced with so many challenges. We have good enthusiasm in our fellowship to continue growing with new groups forming, new sponsors getting certified and experienced sponsors willing to pick up Area Alateen service.

I would like to share that I have been painfully enlightened to how vital Al-Anon support is for survival of Alateen. We continue to be challenged with a shortage of members willing to step up to Alateen group sponsor service.

Of our 50 currently certified Alateen sponsors, less than half are directly serving as a group sponsor. These active group sponsors remain the lifeblood of our Alateen program.

There would be no SC Alateen program without their service. THANK YOU. The more active sponsors the program attracts, the greater the sharing, health and vitality of all its members.

In addition to sponsors, SC Alateen would love to attract more Al-Anon members to help us with our Alateen fund raising efforts. Our Alateen sponsors are already some of the busiest members in the fellowship. Help can come in many ways --- from bringing baked goods to a bake sale, to offering opportunities at your home group to provide scholarships or fundraising.

In 2013 we initiated "Best Seat In the House" at the 2013 Al-Anon/Alateen Convention with some success and hope for continued collaboration at future conventions. Our Alateen fellowship has a lot to share with the Al-Anon community and vice versa. It is in our mutual benefit that we continue working closely together to reach our highest potential.

At AWSC I requested the Area consider a one-time contribution from the (\$5K) profits of 2013 SC Al-Anon/Alateen Convention to contribute to SC Alateen, as Alateens were actively a part of planning, presenting and participating. Funds would be used to grow the scholarship fund and to help replenish many of our camp supplies from first aid, activity supplies to hospitality. We did not have time for in depth discussion so will be bringing this back to the new panel.

Ballots were passed out for voting. After ballots were tallied on the white board for Assembly to see, Joyce H. had two-thirds of the vote and was declared the winner by 43/19.

Second Office up for election was Area Chairman - Jan R. present Area Delegate stood for this position, with no opposition and was unanimously accepted by all 63 votes.

Third Office up for election was Area Alternate Delegate – Diane F. and Melanie M. stood for this position. They each gave a brief description of their qualification for this position. The first vote was 39/29 with no one having the required two-thirds vote. A second vote was taken and was 38/23. At this time Melanie M. withdrew her name and Diane F. was elected.

Forth Office up for election was Area Secretary- Linda R. our past delegate ran unopposed and was unanimously accepted by 63 votes.

Fifth Office up for election was Area Treasurer – Dawn C. ran unopposed and was unanimously accepted by 63 votes.

DISTRICT REPRESENTATIVE REPORTS:

DISTRICT 1 -

DISTRICT 2 – Gene E. - Hi Everyone! Whoa! Time is passing, holidays are coming, and a new year is around the corner! Our September District 2 meeting was held with seventeen members attending from six groups. Our district decided to try four District 2 meetings a year instead of six. Our November meeting, when we elect our new Officers, will be held after the REFLECTOR is published, so we will announce our new Officers in the January edition.

As my term closes, I feel so grateful to have been able to grow through the Traditions and Concepts with the love, help, and encouragement of all of you! I take your sweet smiles and warm hugs with me! Thank you for being you as you grow in your serenity through service. It gave me the opportunity, too!

DISTRICT 3 - Jane K. - I have had an awesome experience as the DR for District 3. During my term of growing and learning our district has had great struggles and triumphs. We have struggled in attendance at district meetings. However the last several meetings had good attendance by the GR's. We have elected most of next year's officers: District Representative- Susan E, Alternate District Representative- Mary Elaine L, and Treasurer- Maureen B. We still need a secretary and public outreach coordinator.

We have two service projects that our district is supporting. Nancy B and Wes B continue to participate and coordinate service in the CHU project in the Allendale Prison system. They are taking in the Al-Anon program and teaching life skills to the inmates. An Al-Anon speaker shares their story once a month. Anyone interested in sharing their story should contact Wes B or Nancy B.

The program CHU (Character-Based Housing Unit) is a program that sponsors education and overall good citizenship which is proven to lower the return rate of the inmates as it prepares them for life on the outside. Individuals that do not have a high school diploma must take the necessary classes to receive a GED. Participants must complete six months of alcohol education as well as six months of drug education. All of these classes are geared to make the inmates more successful upon their release. Following a normal work day, the inmates must participate in two additional classes. All of these programs are peer supervised so no one is going to con the con. These programs are all conducted by volunteers and are self-doubling. There is no cost to the taxpayer.

Our other ongoing project has been to place brochure holders across our community. Many participants have volunteered to make sure the brochure holders remain filled with Al-Anon pamphlets. Most of the groups have put stickers on the brochure holder to identify the Al-Anon group sponsoring the information.

The most fun I have had as District Representative has been the active involvement with our District All Days. We have had a panel of Delegates, amazing speakers, workshops, fun skits, raffles done in all kinds of formats, and auctions. Fun, recovery packed, all days take everyone working together. Participation is the key. I have gotten to know people from all over our Area. I also took the position of treasurer for our 2012 convention. That was the not only fun, but also a huge growth experience. Working on a convention committee allowed me to meet new friends in the

program. My self esteem and confidence in myself improved vastly. I recommend it to everyone!
