Explained AMIAS... Al-Anon Member In Alateen Service. Anyone who is working with or helping with an Alateen group needs to be certified. That includes drivers, backup people, and etc... anyone who is working directly with an Alateen.

As of Friday, we have:

62 AMIAS current people in Area 50 (SC).

19 Alateen Groups in Area 50 (SC)

7 of these are Inactive for the current time.

2 of these are assigned to District 1, which has combined with District 9 now, so we need to get a change form for these two, or let me know if there is no one to support them. Don't want to close them, unless there is no interest to revitalize the Alateen Groups.

I need someone from District 9 to confirm their information, as the Spam Alateen Group is showing a bounced email. So please get with me. I need an email and/or a second sponsor to list with the group. We must have a valid email address for each group.

If any District Representative (DR) would like a further breakdown for your districts, feel free to contact me. Some districts have no registered groups, and some have groups that are all currently inactive.

And a reminder to all DRs and Sponsor's. On the GR3 form, there is now a place for two sponsors' to be listed. It is highly recommended there be two submitted, even if one is only a backup. This will ensure one of you are getting the notices from WSO.

We will be coming up on the renewal/recert of AMIAS people soon. I will try to make this as seamless as possible. More info should be coming out soon. Deadline for this year is May 31, I must have them by the deadline. But, you can submit them any time before then, and I will process it once the recertification date opens, and it will count for the 2017-2018 certification.

Question was asked about forms, and availability.

Answer: All of the WSO forms will soon be available from the SC AI-Anon website. Those who are not a PDF Fillable format, I'm working on updating them, so you can fill them in from your computer and save them. Once saved, any changes are completed by simply opening the old form, make the changes, save it, and email it.

Also, I'm working on the Alateen Packet, trying to get all the required forms in one PDF Fillable document. Should be available soon.

District 4 **Barbara O'Donnell**

I am Barbara O'Donnell, the new District Four Representative for Al-Anon Area 50. District Four includes four counties, Newberry, Lexington, Saluda, Richland and the City of Columbia, totaling approximately 2778 square miles. The World Service Office Online Group Records at <http://www.al-anon.info/OnlineGroupRecords> list twenty six (26) Registered District Four Al-Anon Groups, two (2) of which are inactive.

Thirty-three (33) meetings are held each week, including two Alateen, one Beginners, and one public outreach meeting at Richland Springs/Palmetto Health. The Online Group Records show the smallest group has four (4) members, the largest with fifty (50). The approximate attendance at all meetings based on the Online Group Records is 280-333 per week. This attendance includes those who attend multiple

meetings. This review of the Online Group Records continues as our District continues to update our GR-1 forms in 2017.

Our first District Meeting getting to know each other was held Sunday, January 15 2017, 2:30-4:30, at Virginia Wingard United Methodist Church, 1500 Broad River Road, Columbia. We agreed to meet Sundays every other month: January, March date to be decided, dates confirmed by DR: May 7th, July 9th, Sept 10th and Nov 12th.

There were seventeen (17) In attendance, the new trusted servants are myself, Alternate District Representative Kris Kenealy, Treasurer Janet Lockhart, Secretary Judy McDermott, Alateen Coordinator Shannon Smith, past Treasurer Barbara Edis, Diane Faulkner Area 50 Chair, District Four Holiday dinner Chair Heather, SC Convention 2018 Chair Robin Leshner. Of the twenty four (24) active groups, nine (9) were represented by new or past Group Representatives. The agenda included ASWC January 2017, Budget, Holiday Dinner 2016, rotation of voice mail and District Holiday Dinner and upcoming SC Area 50 Conventions 2017 and 2018,

We received two requests for members to provide public outreach to Lexington Adolescent Recovery Center Substance Use Disorder Intensive Outpatient Program for parents and to join professionals at the RECOVERING COMMUNITY RESOURCE COMMUNITY (RCRC) MEETING Feb 8th and future dates at LARADAC in Columbia. We do not have a Public Outreach Coordinator, but members are willing to participate.

Regarding the District Greater Columbia AFG bank account, the Group Representatives voted to replace the outgoing Treasurer Barbara E and past Treasurer Barbara V, as signatories with the current Treasurer and District Rep; rationale was per the three-year service rotation, the new trusted servants are responsible and available to tend to current District matters, including the bank account. The next week, the new DR and Treasurer met with outgoing Treasurer at the bank to change signatories and to clarify the bank rules and regulations about the primary and four group sub accounts. Since then, the District Treasurer met with the 2018 Convention Treasurer Lis Bleasdale to add the 2018 Convention as a sub account SCAFG 2018 CONVENTION, under the District Four Federal Tax ID number. I suggest this issue be further discussed at the AWSC.

We are downloading and updating all the Al-anon/Alateen Guidelines to keep on hand for the District Meetings.

In 2016, District Four voted to end the contract for the Phone Book Yellow Page ad; the rationale was to save money due to the increase in online searches for Al-Anon phone number, information and meetings.

Costs for voicemail and Yellow Pages Phone Book advertising was \$130.00 per month, total annual cost: \$1560. Yellow Pages AD cost: \$62.00 per month, \$744.00 annual. Voicemail with white page listing cost is now 68.00 month, \$816.00 annual; savings is \$744.00 annual.

There approximately 13 teens that attend the two Alateen meetings and ten (10) District Four certified Alateen Sponsors.

The group voted to purchase 200 copies of Al-Anon Faces Alcohol in English and 25 copies in Spanish to distribute to the groups. Other pertinent business was addresses.

Most of the groups of District 6 are doing fairly well. One of the biggest obstacles hurting the district at this time is the geographical distance in District 6. At one time, district meetings were held in Walterboro, which is an approximate half-way mark. The building that was being used is no longer available. Now, the district meets twice in Bluffton and twice in St. George during the year in an attempt to require a long-distance drive for members only twice a year. The seeming result is that the members go to the meeting when it is near them and don't go when it's further. This is a work in progress and hopefully will be worked out during this service rotation.

As the DR, I plan to visit all groups in our district at least once during the 3-year term.
